

URGENT APPEAL FOR TIGER FUNDING

Every year at this time 21st Century Tiger hold a Project Review deciding how best your hard raised funds should be spent. This is how some of it helped last year...

£9,568 went to WCS - Russia to support their important project 'Amur Tigers and Far Eastern Leopards in Russia: Research, Training and Capacity Building'. Worrying reports are reaching us that Amur tiger numbers are in decline in the Russian Far East. Funding another years work monitoring the current tiger population must remains a top priority.

Fauna and Flora International assigned £194 of their £9,307 grant to medical emergencies. Should any of the valuable Kerinci Tiger Protection Team get injured or sick it is crucial that they get treatment quickly so they can get back out on patrol as well as helping train ZSL's new Berbak rangers!

We allocated £10,059 to The Zoological Society of London's project 'Tackling Berbak Wildlife Crime in Sumatra.' These funds weren't just for training rangers to dismantle snares, aquire basic field skills and set up information networks. Working far from home the trainee rangers also required £1,034 for food and lodging.

The Phoenix Fund in the Russian Far East received £10,000 for their Amur Tiger Conservation Project. As well as funding Phoenix's vital anti-poaching efforts, £700 was allocated to the hugely successful Terney Tiger Day Festival.

The Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS) - India spent £760 of their £3,722 grant on camera traps to record wildlife usage of roads in their vital project aimed at reducing wildlife mortality on roads running through the Nagarahole-Bandipur corridor.
